

PRACTICE OF THE INFINITIVE. The infinitive is the noun of the verb, so it can be declined, using the article when necessary. Decline the following infinitives, writing the English equivalent for each case.

MODEL

διδάσκω = to teach

<i>case</i>	<i>(the infinitive has no plural)</i>	<i>translation</i>
<i>nom</i>	//τὸ// διδάσκειν	to teach / teaching
<i>gen</i>	τοῦ διδάσκειν	of teaching
<i>dat</i>	τῷ διδάσκειν	by teaching / (sometimes) to or for teaching
<i>acc</i>	ἐθέλω διδάσκειν	I wish to teach
