TUR 1501 Beginning Turkish I

Turkish has becoming an important language. Department of State, Department of Education and Department of Defense are supporting studying Turkish under an initiative called Critical Languages Initiative. This course covers basic Turkish grammar as well as conversation. We will start from ABC. Previous knowledge of Turkish is not required.(MW 10:00-13:00)

HIS 3395 Turkish History: An Introduction

This course is a survey of the Turkish history from earlier times in Central Asia into the modern period focusing on the Ottoman and modern Turkish history. We will explore the Turks and their world following a chronological narrative of key political and military developments with detours and stops along the way to consider different aspects of the societal framework such as inter-communal relations, the role of women, changing modes of sociability and urban culture. We will discuss the sultans and wars as well as institutions such as the Ottoman military, pious foundations and organizational structure. We will briefly discuss current issues and challenges such as the modernization and EU membership process of Turkey, long standing cooperation between Turkey and US and current social and political issues in modern Turkey. No previous knowledge of Turkish history or language is required.
