The course gives undergraduate and graduate students a basic outline of major theoretical and cultural trends from the birth of Western modernity through World War II. Significant texts cover the Enlightenment and Revolution, Marxism and Liberalism, Feminism and Psychoanalysis, Totalitarianism, Genocide and Postcolonialism. Frequent presentations by expert professors make this course of special value for students wishing the richest possible UH educational experience.

Prerequisite: ENG 1304 or equivalent. The course counts toward the new WCL Minor—see description on the web at <http://www.class.uh.edu/mcl>.

The course may count toward MCL language major for very advanced language students with permission of your major director; it is also available for Graduate credit but please contact your graduate advisor for confirmation.
